- **Pan-African** initiative to restore **100 million** hectares of degraded land by 2030
- Contributes to **Bonn Challenge** and **New York Declaration of Forests**
- **Launched at COP21 (Paris 2015) by:**
 - African Union Development Agency (AUDA-NEPAD)
 - World Resources Institute (WRI)
 - Germany's Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ)
 - GIZ
